

FCT 1e 60 Index

Strategy description

The FCT 1e 60 Index strategy is a purely passive investment strategy made available to FCT 1e company affiliates and insured members.

The investment strategy aims to replicate the Pictet LPP 2000 60 index consisting of equities (60%) and bonds. The strategy is entirely invested in low-cost, passive funds managed by Credit Suisse and UBS Asset Management. The strategy is rebalanced monthly back to target weights.

The strategy is appropriate for investors with a high capacity / willingness to take risks and an investment horizon of 10 or more years.
